Angel A. Dizon III is the General Services Administration's Public Buildings Service Regional Commissioner for the Great Lakes Region (Region 5). The region provides public platforms for 50,000 federal employees in 1,000 owned/leased assets (35 million square feet) within six states bordering the Great Lakes. He leads 550 staff responsible for the full life cycle of the assets. He is focused on providing federal public platforms that have positive economic, environmental and social impacts in their communities.



Angel served as the Department of State's Bureau of Overseas Buildings Operations managing director and held multiple positions within the Bureau (real estate, planning, design, project management, etc.). He oversaw resources for the major capital and renovation programs valued at approximately \$20B annually, the owned portfolio valued at over \$80B, and the leased portfolio valued at \$600M annually. As the managing director, he led 400 staff in cost management, design management, project management and special project management to support 291 missions globally. Angel led innovation at OBO and was instrumental in the transformation of the Bureau's approach toward U.S. Embassy design. The result has been the recognition of numerous architecture, engineering and construction industry awards.

Angel has over 30 years of real estate, planning, design and construction expertise serving as a consultant to the federal government and as a public servant. He has been recognized with numerous awards for his leadership and superior performance. His experience includes: General Services Administration, Department of State, Office of the Secretary of Defense, Department of the Army, Internal Revenue Service, and multiple other federal/state government agencies.
